INSTITUTIONAL ANCHORS

One of the seven neighborhood components · Activity 3 (what makes it viable) and Activity 4 (what undermines it)

This board mapped what has to be present for institutions to act as anchors for a neighborhood rather than over it, the conditions under which an institution holds power and resources in service of the common good. The group named the barriers that undermine those conditions and the larger forces, placed as drivers, working from the Activity 2 dimensions carried in below. Read from the session photos and provisional until David's transcription.

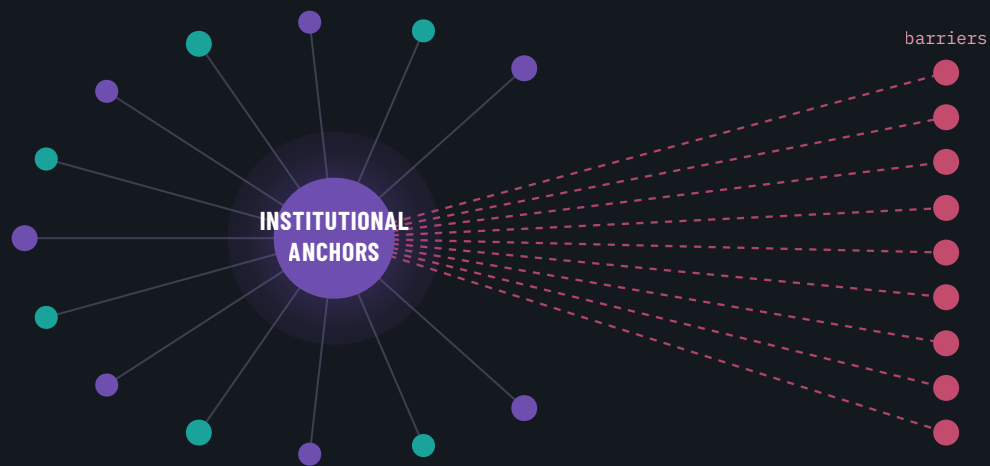
WHAT UNDERMINES IT

B1 Lack of interest in the common good (only taking care of our own)	B2 Holding onto power, control, memory, and money for the few instead of using it toward the next good
B3 Program imposed from outside	B4 Decisions made about communities by people unaffected by the outcomes of their decisions
B5 Charismatic leader who doesn't share power or work well with others	B6 Power centralized in one or two people or families
B7 Colonial theology	B8 MIA, or the unrealized potential of churches
B9 Not at the table, or underrepresented neighbors placed on a yellow condition note in red	

THE BOARD AT A GLANCE

AROUND THE COMPONENT

Institutional anchors at the center, the enabling conditions around it, and the barriers the group named set apart in rose. The Activity 2 dimensions are the anchors these attach to. Drivers are listed above, not drawn.



OPEN, AND WORTH CARRYING FORWARD

THREADS

T1

THE DIMENSIONS CARRY FORWARD

The dot appears to land on connection to the institution, read provisionally from the photo. Confirm the voted dimension in revision.

T2

DRIVER OR BARRIER

Capitalism, the Doctrine of Discovery, and institutional failure were placed as green drivers. Revisit whether they read as drivers or barriers.

T3

A CONDITION OR A GAP

"Not at the table, or underrepresented neighbors" was placed on the conditions side but reads as a barrier. Decide where it belongs.

T4

OVERLAPPING MIDDLE

This board shares a sheet with Recognition & Belonging, and the money, margin, and power notes sit between them. A few were partly hidden. David's transcription settles attribution.
